

Siberian Dog Boy



A wild boy who seems to have been raised by a dog since he was three months old has been discovered living in a remote part of Siberia seven years after he was abandoned by his parents.

Andrei Tolstyk, now seven, was found by social workers who wondered why the boy was not enrolled at his local school in the picturesque Siberian region of Altai.

Having been isolated from human contact for so long, Andrei could not talk and had adopted many dog-like traits including walking on all fours, biting people, sniffing his food before he ate it and general feral behaviour.

Andrei, like Rudyard Kipling's fictional Mowgli in *The Jungle Book*, had spent almost his entire youth in the company of animals. According to the local press, his very existence had been forgotten. His mother left home when he was just three months old, entrusting Andrei's care to his alcoholic, invalid father who also appears to have abandoned the boy soon afterwards and drifted away.

The hamlet of Bespalovskoya, where the family lived, was so sparsely populated and the house so remote that the parents' absence went unnoticed by the few other inhabitants. Instead, Andrei reportedly forged a close bond with the only

other living thing around, the family guard dog, which somehow helped him survive and grow up.

Doctors say Andrei was born with speech and hearing problems but that his wayward parents made no effort to seek medical treatment for him before they left. Andrei has been dubbed the "Dog Boy" by some sections of the Russian media; he has now been moved to a shelter for orphans in a nearby town where he is being encouraged to mix with other children.

When he first arrived at the shelter, staff told the Russian news agency RIA-Novosti that he was afraid of people, behaved aggressively and erratically and continued to sniff all his food before eating it. They were, however, able to communicate with him using basic sign language. Two weeks after his arrival they say he began to walk on two legs and has since mastered the art of eating with a spoon, making his own bed and playing with a ball.

The other orphans are reported to be suspicious of the boy they call "wild", but Andrei is said to have struck up a friendship with a little girl with whom he communicates using sign language.

Doctors, paediatricians and psychologists are currently trying to work out whether Andrei can be taught normal human be-

haviour. If he shows good progress, he will be transferred to another children's home; otherwise he will be dispatched to a specialist boarding school. Police are hunting for his parents, who are likely to face charges of neglect and endangerment.

Andrei Tolstyk's is not the first case of a "feral child" in Russia. As reported in OUR DOGS in 1998, police near Moscow rescued Ivan Mishukov, then aged six, from a pack of wild dogs with which he had lived for two years. Ivan had left the family home when he was four to get away from his mother and her abusive alcoholic boyfriend. He took to begging and won the dogs' trust by offering them scraps of food. In return, they protected him, from the cold and from other humans, and apparently made him their pack leader. Police finally managed to separate the boy from the dogs by leaving bait for the pack in a restaurant kitchen.

Although there have been many well-documented cases of children raised by wild animals – there have, however, been a number of "feral child" hoaxes. The website FeralChildren.com lists some more far-fetched cases – among them are the "The Wild Boy of Burundi", "The Delphos Wolf Girl", and "the Syrian gazelle-boy".

Pets are good for our Health

We all know how much love and companionship our dogs bring to our lives but do we realize how they are a positive influence on our health and well being? There is great evidence to prove that pets have a positive impact on a number of health conditions. Studies have shown that pets have many benefits to our health, including lower cholesterol and blood pressure and reduced stress. Scientists don't know why this is but some theorize that the act of petting a dog can release positive endorphins in the brain, helping bodies to maintain 'homeostasis' (which is a good thing). Research has also

shown that pet ownership increases the odds of survival for people who have a heart attack.

Pet ownership can also offer many benefits to older people as well. A recent study showed that senior citizens who own pets are less likely to be depressed, are better able to tolerate social isolation (if this applies to the individual) and are more active than those who do not own pets.

Studies have shown that individuals who own a dog:

- Are ill less frequently than those who do not have a dog
- If they do get ill, they are quicker to recover if they have had surgery experience faster healing times

- Are less likely to suffer from depression and loneliness
- Have higher self-esteem

Enjoy less stress and anxiety in the company of pets (as opposed to friends and spouses present)

We all need something to live for in our lives and something to focus on. Pets offer us unconditional love, which is of significant benefit to our overall well being. Our relationship with our pet is unique. Our pets depend on us, and being needed motivates us to stay well

Samoyed Sayings

Samoyed breed column from "Our Dogs" 9 September 1932

Samoyed owners read this column, and I know that a lot of other people do so, too; but is it ever looked at by the majority of those who are now deciding the destinies of the awards in the Samoyed show rings? The immediate inspiration of these remarks was a comment made in one of last week's show reports by a famous all-round judge, but the primary reason for them is a growing feeling of alarm by many Samoyed exhibitors (an alarm continually reflected in my correspondence) at the judicial attitude of so many all-rounders towards the breed. In days gone by such an attitude would not have mattered very much because it was the specialist who awarded most of the prizes; today the all-rounders' attitude is of the first-rate importance because the all-rounders have practically a monopoly of the championship and other leading shows.

No one has a more genuine admiration for our British all-round judges than I have, and without their wide knowledge and great experience, the judicial problem would be a far more difficult one that it is – in dogdom as a whole, I mean. But I think we have the right to demand from all-rounders when they judge Samoyeds, that they make their Awards by the accepted and long-established Samoyed standard, and not by their own ideas of what a Samoyed should be. I frankly and gladly admit that some all-rounders judge by the

Samoyed standard, but the majority, if their awards, and especially their reportorial remarks, are any criterion, certainly do not. For example, despite all that has been said and written about the absolute incorrectness of a cobby body on a Samoyed, are we any nearer disabusing the minds of the great majority of all-round judges that "cobby," "compact" and "short-coupled" Samoyeds are completely wrong, than we were when all-round judges only occasionally officiated in Samoyed show rings.

There are other illustrations of disregard of the breed's standard, but let us take last week's judicial criticism which, as I said, was the immediate inspiration of this paragraph. The comment was on a Samoyed exhibit and read: "I had to be severe on his (what we judges term) 'Dudley nose', which breeders may know better as 'flesh-colour'." "If the judge who wrote that were alone in his opinion on the question of Samoyed nose colour, I should not have bothered to deal with it here, but that judge is not alone and his attitude fairly accurately represents the general attitude of all-rounders towards other-than-black noses in Samoyeds.

If I ask the judges who insist on black noses, why they penalise "Dudley" noses, I shall probably be told that black is the correct nose-colour in most canine breeds. Granted! But one cannot apply a general standard to a breed which the general standard does not fit. The Samoyed standard makes perfectly plain that while black noses are preferable, when all

other points are equal, noses (and eye-rims, too) "may be brown or flesh-colour". These six words in inverted commas were not put into the standard to meet a failing of the breed at the time. They were put in for a very definite purpose, a purpose which is as present to-day as it was when the standard was formulated; long experience had proved that while black noses were not difficult to "fix" in Samoyeds, they were not infrequently allied to faults, or they did not carry with them the attributes which the flesh-coloured noses did. Of course, every black nose then had not those faults, any more than every black nose has to-day; but it was realised that to make black noses a stipulation in the standard would eliminate several most essential Samoyed characteristics. Long experienced breeders are acutely aware that that holds good to-day every whit as much as it did when the standard was drawn up.

The reason for safeguarding the brown-nosed exhibits would require more space for detailing than is available in this column, but, to put it briefly, the Samoyed is not originally or inherently a black-nosed breed, and even black noses may change their colour at certain times. I know no standard which was given more careful thought in its compilation than that of the Samoyed, and while, naturally, the wording (though not the application) of some of its phrases was discussed at length before it was issued in its complete form, the brown nose "permission", or the mere preference for a black nose when all other points were

“equal” was one of the most unanimous and most emphasised feature of the whole standard; incidentally, one of the other features equally emphasised by the compilers of the standard was the correct body, the definition of which was deliberately “wordy”, so that there might be no possible dubiety about it. As I have said, the Samoyed fancy is becoming seriously alarmed at the contradiction of the standard which features in so many awards to-day, and there is the fear (not a groundless one, by any means) that if things go on as they are doing, the breed will be changed (“ruined” is the word which generally appears in my correspondence) to meet the demands of the adjudicators. And whatever is the cause of it, it is a fact that, in spite of a huge increase in the number of exhibitors and ex-

hibits, Samoyed merit in general is on a much lower scale to-day than it was, say, ten years ago, to go no further back. The outstanding exhibits of the moment belong not to the second half of the first post-war decade, but to the first four or five years of that period. The levelling-up of quality in the lower rungs of the classes must not blind us to the fact that there has been a serious levelling down of merit in the higher rungs.

The open winners at St George’s Bristol, were Miss Keyte-Perry’s Ch Leader of the Arctic in dogs, and Ch Winter, in bitches; the respective second-bests were Mrs Edwards’s Guyon (a dog which was making his debut here, and recording a fine beginning by taking two firsts and two seconds in breed classes, and four

firsts and a third in varieties), and Miss Stuckey’s famous Edelweiss. The best puppy was Mr Gibb’s now familiar Barr Duke, which later stood second in an A.V. class of 17 puppies. The other premier places were filled by Miss Jones’s Zazazon (whose distemper coloured teeth will not, I hope, lead to foolish penalising as they did on a previous occasion) and Miss Keyte-Perry’s Zone of the Arctic.





Minty and MJ

M.J. was an easy pup to live with, relaxed, cruise but very stubbin. M.J. was a nick-name we gave him because he was Monty's Grandson , short for Monty Junior, and the name just stuck.

He did few things wrong in life, but it was hard work to teach him something! A bad habit he had, 'was eating stones! The Garden & driveway were covered in stones. I thought to myself, 'Not a problem, I have taught many Samoyeds to leave things alone'. You hold the item in front of them & when they go to take it, you say a firm 'NO'. This works on 95% of Samoyeds. Well with M.J., I think he thought it was a game. He would try to grab the stone out of my hand & run before I could stop him! After 5 minutes and little progress, I decided to leave the training for another day!

The next thing to teach him was show training. He was 10 months before I managed to get through to him what he was suppose to do. We had just been awarded Puppy of Group at a large All Breeds Champ show. M.J. had this look of "O, this is what you want me to do ", he got Puppy in Show later that day.

Minty (his Sister) came home to live with us around M.J.'s 1st Birthday, Minty was very different from M.J., she was Bossy, Intelligent & a leader. Minty taught M.J. that if you want a quite life, girls are always right and you just follow behind them. They lived together for 12 years and Minty was still the Boss until the day she died.

M.J. was 3 when we bought a Life style Block. A week before we moved in, one of the young Samoyeds came into Season, with Minty sure to follow in Season, only stock fences and 81m square Garage/Workshop to live in, we had M.J. de-sexed before we moved onto the land. Buying the land was the best move we made, but lots of work planning & Building Dog areas, fences, our house. It meant that we spent a lot of time outside with the dogs running round loose. On one of these times, M.J. found a rabbit, off went the rabbit with M.J. on his tail. The rabbit went though the stock fence & M.J. ran straight into it! M.J. picked himself up off the ground, had a look to see where the rabbit had gone and walked off in discuss. We never saw him chase a rabbit again; he would just stand and bark if the girls were after a rabbit.

M.J. was the 1st Samoyed that I had loose with the chickens, the trouble was, the chickens weren't afraid of him, if the weather was wet, they would nearly be sitting on top of him and if I gave him a biscuit, the chickens would try to pinch it.


